We Can Do Something About It

We can call on state and national leaders to do something about climate change. From the local level, we can insist on solutions at the national level.

We've Done it Before

In 1983 New Hampshire conservation organizations, the scientific community and citizens in town meeting called upon state and national leaders to address the emerging threat of acid rain.

Many said that solving acid rain couldn't be done—that the science was uncertain, the problem too complex for ordinary citizens to understand, or too remote, or not of local concern. Others complained that the costs were too high.

Nevertheless, we persevered. Today sulfur emissions are cut by more than a third without the high costs some claimed and with net benefits to the economy. And NH forests are rebounding.

Let's Lead Again

We must take action to reduce carbon pollution at the *national* level as well as in our local communities. As citizens, we must seek policies that are environmentally effective, equitable *and* economically responsible.
